Ask Delbert?

Q. My steel door does not have a fire label on it and the opening requires a door with a fire label. What do I do?

A. First of all, check your door very carefully. Fire labels are usually located between the top and middle hinge. Many manufacturers use Mylar labels, with a protective coating on the surface, this protects the label in the event paint or primer covers the label. If this occurs, you may carefully remove this protective coating, making your label visible for inspection. Use caution when removing this coating as it should peel away easily. If you encounter resistance, you may be removing the actual label from the doors edge. If this occurs, you will invalidate the label and a new one will be required. Labels can only be applied by the factory, authorized distributors or a representative of the labeling agency. Anything other than this is ILLEGAL! Finally, Make sure that you ordered your door with a fire label. If you do not let your representative know that you require a label, you will not receive one. When in doubt, request a fire label. The cost of adding a fire label to a door or frame is minimal vs. the cost of ordering and shipping a replacement item.
